



### Global population, 1950-2100 billions, central projection





Global population growth, 1950-2100 Estimated and projected growth rates percent per year






Regional population, 1950-2100 billion per region, central projection





#### Projected population of middle income countries, 1950-2050 Range of projections with 95% confidence interval




Global population median age, 1950-2100 median age in years







### Global population median age, 1950-2100 median age in years, country groups





---- More developed regions (North America, Europe, Australia/New Zealand, Japan)


—Less developed regions (Latin America, Caribbean, Africa, Asia ex Japan, Oceania ex Australia/New Zealand)

---- Less developed regions ex China







Global urbanisation, 1950-2050


